
Wharf J9 Replacement and Resilient Shoreline Project





About the Project

Wharf J9 forms part of the working fishing industry character of Fisherman's Wharf. It provides small vessel berths and public access to the protected Outer Lagoon. This aging timber bulkhead and wharf is currently closed for public safety and unavailable for operation due to deterioration and shoreline erosion. The Port's Multi-Hazard Risk Assessment found the shoreline here to be at very high risk for earthquake lateral spreading as well as quickly emerging flood risk. The Wharf J9 Replacement and Resilient Shoreline Project is an opportunity to revitalize and reopen this space with a new wharf and bulkhead that is stable in earthquakes, increases flood defenses, and better connects San Franciscans and visitors to the unique working fishing industry. Opportunities will be explored to enhance public access and improve habitat, such as living seawall treatments. Ideas developed in this project will be used to inform other areas of the Fisherman's Wharf shoreline.
