Project Overview

- The project addresses environmental impacts from the historic operations of the former Beach Street Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) that operated in the 1900s.
- Cleanup involves remediating impacted sediment at five work areas from 2025-2030 during regulatory in-water work window (June-November).
- Cleanup includes dredging and capping of work areas extending from the shoreline to approximately 1,000 feet offshore.
- Remediation Project Permits Issued
 - Regional Water Board permit October 2024
 - BCDC permit December 2024
 - Army Corps permit January 2025





Areas A and B Milestones

- USS Pampanito temporarily relocated - February 2025
- Red & White Fleet temporary relocation – March through May 2025
- PG&E mobilization of equipment begins May 2025
- PG&E remediation construction work June through November 2025

Project construction work will comply with local, state and federal project permits.

Site control measures and environmental protection plans include:

- Health and Safety Plan
- Water Quality Monitoring Plan
- Marine Mammal Monitoring Plan
- Dust, Vapor and Odor Control Plan
- Community Air Monitoring Plan
- Waste Management and Transportation Plan

Monitoring results will be submitted to the Regional Water Board and made available to the public.



Project oversight by the Regional Water Board and Port staff will include site inspections to ensure compliance.


