2. Waterfront Resilience Program Update (Brad Benson)

- The Port, in collaboration with the Army Corp of Engineers, is currently focused on flood study and coastal risks.
- Sea level rise is the driver of damage along the coastal lines.

3. Fisherman's Wharf Forward Presentation (David Beaupre)

- Fisherman's Wharf Forward is a project aimed to improve the heart of Fisherman's Wharf, primarily areas around Pier 45, Taylor and Jefferson streets and the Wharf's Inner Lagoon.
- The Port worked with the Community Benefits District to mitigate the illegal vending and the flea market activities during and after the pandemic.
- With vacant restaurants, the Port brought in Sky Star (ferris wheel) which has been a major attraction.

4. Maritime Update (Andre Coleman, Dominic Moreno, Joe Monroe)

- The Port Commission approved a 5-year dredge contract awarded to Dutra.
- On the forward calendar in August and September Commission meeting:
 - Request approval to amend existing License with Pacific Cruise Ship Terminal for cruise terminal workers to park at Pier 19.5.
 - > Request approval for a new Foreign Trade Zone operator in Vacaville.
 - ➤ Request waiver of 6 months' rent for our fish berth holders and 3 months' rent for the fish processors who were impacted by the close of commercial salmon season.
 - Informational presentation on Port's Maritime Portfolio (FY 24/25).
 - Request to amend our harbor fee schedule and approve a new maritime berthing/storage policy at South Beach harbor.
- In comparison to last year, cargo is down 30% and dry bulk is down 40%.
- On the cruise side, the Port had its' 2nd highest year of passenger count with just under 370,000 passengers.
- Due to high winds last April, Pier 35 was taken offline due to sheared bollards.
 So far, we have diverted 4 cruise calls to Pier 80.
- A feasibility study is underway for Pier 80 as an option for a secondary cruise berth. The biggest challenge is electrification as CARB regulations require 100% plug in when a vessel is berthed.
- The Maritime Internship Program partnered with Cal Maritime to expose youths to the maritime industry. The interns will make a presentation to Port staff next week.
- Fleet Week runs from October 5 -13 this year.
- The U.S. Navy is planning to bring three ships.
- The Colombian tall ship *Gloria* will be berthed at Pier 15/17 from October 9-13.
- The LCU offload will be at Pier 68, followed by police escort to Pier 30/32 until the offload is complete.

- The Navy is planning to berth a DDG class vessel at Pier 27 from October 6-12, then relocate before a cruise ship arrives on Sunday.
