## Mission

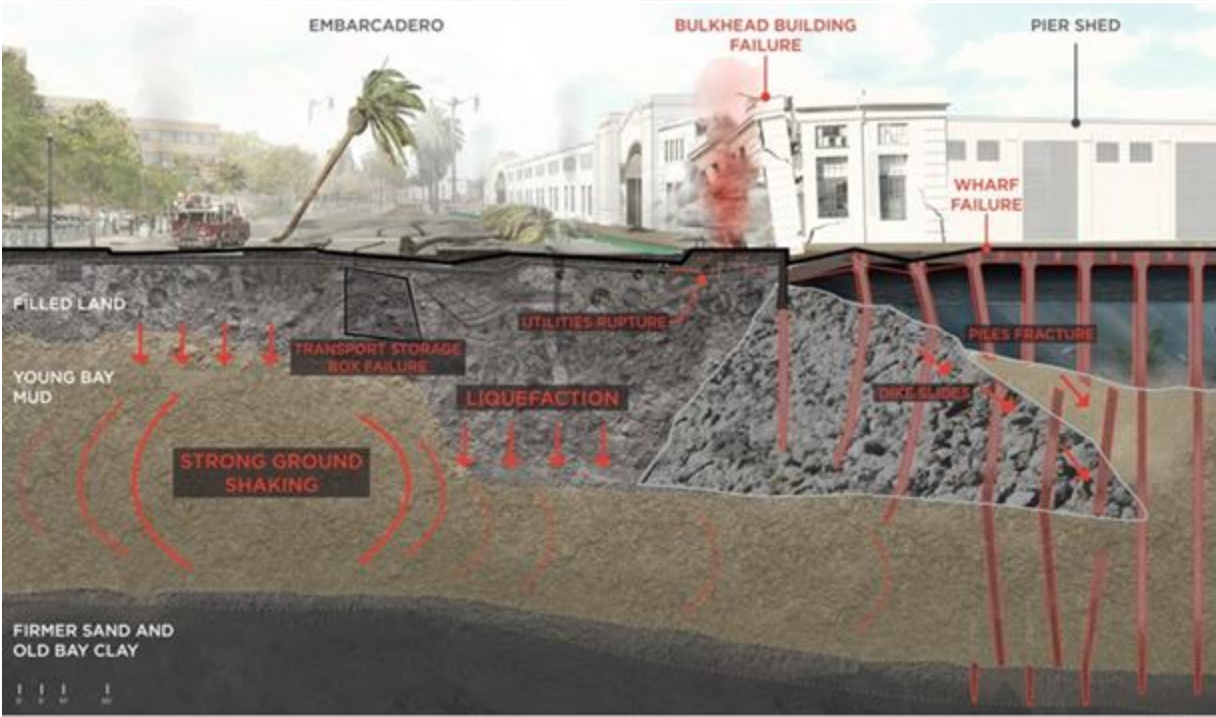

San Francisco's waterfront faces urgent flood risks **today**

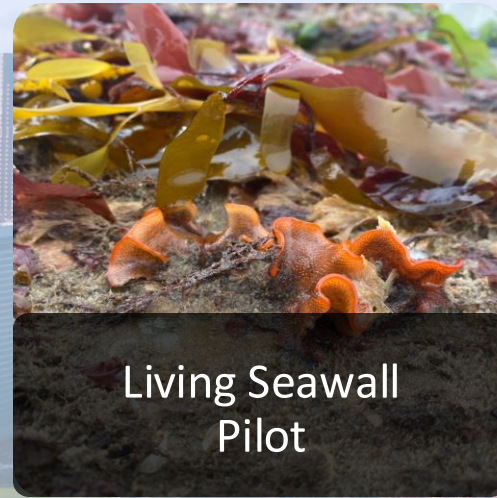
