Keynote Speaker



JOYCE GUY IS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WEST OAKLAND JOB RESOURCE CENTER, WHERE SHE AIDS COMMUNITY MEMBERS SEEKING JOB SUPPORT SERVICES IN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. SHE'S A UNITED STATES ARMY VETERAN, A FORMER JOURNEY LEVEL IRONWORKER WITH OVER 25 YEARS OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT EXPERIENCES, WORKING AT VARIOUS PUBLIC, LABORER AND NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS.

HER WONDROUS CAREER AS AN IRONWORKER, BEGAN IN THE 1980S, WHEN MS. GUY WAS A PARTICIPANT IN SAN FRANCISCO'S WOMEN IN APPRENTICESHIPS PROGRAM. SHE STATED, HER MENTORS RICHIE GORE AND SUSIE SUAFAI, TWO LEGENDARY WOMEN OF THE TRADES MADE HER TIME IN THE ARMY FEEL LIKE A TRIP TO DISNEY WORLD.

MS. GUY'S FIRST JOB ASSESSMENT WAS AT SAN FRANCISCO'S SHIPYARD WHERE SHE WORKED AS A WELDER. WORK IN THE SHIPYARDS BROUGHT TONS CHALLENGES, RANGING FROM MS. GUY RUNNING BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN THE VARIOUS VESSELS AND ON-SITE SHOP TO DROP OFF TOOLS TO CLEANING UP BEHIND HER MALE COWORKERS. THESE TASKS CHANGED AFTER MS. GUY WATCHED EIGHT MALE CO-WORKERS STUMPED ON HOW TO FIX A WELDING MACHINE. AFTER HEARING HER COLLEAGUES' FRUSTRATIONS, MS. GUY, FOUND THE PROBLEM AND RESET THE MACHINE. THIS LED HER TO WORK ON VARIOUS TYPES OF VESSELS, SUCH AS CRUISE, MILITARY, AND CARGO SHIPS INCLUDING FANCY YACHTS. SHE SAYS BECOMING AN IRONWORKER WAS THE BEST CAREER SHE EVER HAD. MS. GUY IS A PROUD MEMBER OF IRONWORKERS LOCAL 378.

SHE LEARNED HER CONSTRUCTION SKILLS FROM HER LATE FATHER, FRANK GUY, WHO OWNED GUY AND SON HAULING. MS. GUY WAS A DADDY'S GIRL WHO MIMICKED EVERYTHING HER FATHER DID FROM PULLING COPPER WIRING OUT CABLES TO HAULING JUNK FOR HIS BUSINESS. DURING HER ILLUSTRIOUS CAREER, MS. GUY HAS BEEN FEATURED IN MAGAZINES, NEWSPAPERS AND A BOOK CALLED BUILDING THE GOLDEN GATE, HIGHLIGHTING WOMEN IN NON-TRADITIONAL OCCUPATIONS. IN ADDITION TO BEING A TRAILBLAZER IN THE MARITIME INDUSTRY, SHE IS A PROUD MOM OF TWO SONS, DONTRELLE WILLIS, AND WALTER BLAKELY.
